




Q1. Do you think you could name up to three different types of taxes that either you personally pay, or that might be paid by other people in Scotland?





Q3. Thinking about how well-off your household is compared to other households in Scotland nowadays, would you say your household is...?




NET Well-Off compared to other households in Scotland


Q4. Which of the statements below comes closest to your own view?




Q6. To what extent, if at all, do you believe the tax system in the UK as a whole is progressive?







Q7. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement? 'Lower-income households should pay a lower share of their income in tax than higher-income households'






Q8. Thinking about Scotland, which of the following statements is closest to your view?

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






Q11. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement? 'The taxes I pay make the UK Government accountable to me for how it spends money'






Q12. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement? 'The taxes I pay give me a stake in decisions the Scottish Government makes'






Q13. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement? 'The taxes I pay give me a stake in decisions the UK Government makes'






